Ireland says farewell to Gay Byrne

Irish people at home and abroad were saddened to learn of the passing of one of Ireland's greatest broadcasters, Gay Byrne. For almost 60 years Gay was very much a part of every Irish home. He was the presenter and producer of the Late Late Show from 1962 to 1999 and presented a morning radio show, Monday to Friday for 25 years.

Born in Dublin in 1934, he began his career with RTE in 1957 and apart from spending a short time working in Manchester he spent the rest of his career with RTE.



Ireland in the 60's, 70's and 80's was a country run by the laws of the Catholic Church and the State who decided what topics were allowed in books, newspapers and TV programmes. Information on subjects such as sex, family planning and other family issues was not available and certainly not spoken about. However Gay gave a voice to people to speak about what was happening in their lives and broadcast programmes that gave information to the men and women of Ireland so that they were informed.

His radio programme was the first to broadcast phone calls from the public live on air, often not knowing what subject was going to be brought up. The Late Late Show held lively debates from opposing sides on topics such as divorce and abortion. It was not unusual for Gay and RTE to receive hundreds of letters of complaint from the clergy and others after such debates.

On a lighter note he started the Late Late Toy Show which is as popular today as ever. He was also the first to give air time to up and coming bands and singers where appearing on the Late Late Show meant instant fame. Bands such as U2, Boyzone and Westlife all had their first TV appearance on Gay's Late Late show.

Gay was the host of the Rose of Tralee for several years and presented the Irish version of "Who Wants to be a Millionaire".

A few years after his retirement Gay returned to host a series "The Meaning of Life" in which he interviewed famous people on their thoughts on death and life after death. He also presented a jazz show on Lyric FM.

His funeral mass was held in St Mary's Cathedral in Dublin. Thousands of people lined the streets of Dublin to bid him farewell. Gay is survived by his wife Kathleen Watkins, and his daughters Crona and Suzy and their families. May he rest in peace


