Climb with Charlie



More than two million Euro has so far been raised by the "Climb with Charlie" event which took place on Saturday 2 April. The former RTÉ journalist, Charlie Bird, who was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease (MND) last year, set himself the goal of hiking to the top of Croagh Patrick in Co Mayo. The climb was to represent all those with serious illness whose every day struggles can be like climbing a mountain.

Several hundred walkers joined him in Mayo on the day including some well-known people such as Ryan Tubridy and singer Daniel O Donnell. Thousands of others took part in the very many other "Climb with Charlie" events which took place across Ireland and in parts of the world such as America, Australia and Africa.

Motor Neuron Disease is an illness that affects a person's brain and nerves and causes the muscles of the body to become weaker over time. Unfortunately, there is no cure for this illness but there are treatments and medications that can help a person to live with it. A person with the disease can also lose the ability to speak which is what has happened to Charlie. However, with the help of technology that recorded him speaking before he lost his speech, he can type words into a device that will then play his message using Charlie's own voice.

The RTE concert orchestra along with some of Charlie's former workmates in RTÉ also came together to record a song, "Shine a Light", all the money raised from sales of the song will be added to the fund. The money raised will go the Irish Motor Neurone Disease Association and Pieta, Ireland's national suicide prevention charity.

Pieta is an organisation that provides free counselling and support to those who are in danger of suicide or self-harm. They have 20 centres around Ireland and employ over 200 trained staff. They also run a 24-hour freephone helpline. Since the service first opened its doors in Dublin in 2006, Pieta has helped more than 60,000 people. They also support families who have been affected by suicide.



On 7 May Pieta will hold their annual "Darkness into Light" sponsored walks all across Ireland. At sunrise on that morning thousands of people in many parts of the world will walk and pledge money so that the organisation can continue to support people who are struggling to cope. The walk is called "Darkness into Light" because Pieta offer light and hope to those who feel they are in a dark and lonely place.
