A New Taoiseach



Simon Harris is the new Taoiseach and leader of the government. He became leader of the Fine Gael party following the shock resignation of Leo Varadkar who decided to stand down a few weeks earlier. Mr Harris was then voted in as Taoiseach by the majority of the TDs (Teachta Dála, member of Parliament in Ireland) currently elected. At 37, he is the youngest person to be appointed Taoiseach of Ireland.

Simon Harris grew up in Greystones in County Wicklow. His family were not involved in politics but the young Harris was always interested in community and current affairs. As a teenager he set up a support group for people with disabilities. His brother, Adam, has a condition known as Asperger's Syndrome.

Harris has been actively involved in politics since his early 20's. He was elected to Wicklow County Council in the 2009 local elections and was elected as a TD for Wicklow in the 2011 general election. At that time, he was known as the "baby of the Dáil" due to his election at the young age of 24. He has held several posts in government. From 2016 to 2020 he was Minister for Health and from 2020 he was Minister for Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science.

In his first speech as Taoiseach he promised to work hard for the country, to provide more housing, improve health care and provide better mental health services and services for people with disabilities. Simon Harris is married to Caoimhe who is a nurse and they have two children, Saoirse and Cillian.

The Stardust Tragedy



After 43 years the families of the victims of the Stardust Tragedy have finally been given the verdict that they had been fighting for. A jury returned a verdict that the 48 people who died in the fire were killed unlawfully.

A previous enquiry which was held back in 1982 had said that the fire had been started deliberately, however the families never accepted this.

A majority decision from the jury of seven women and five men found the blaze, which broke out in the early hours of Valentine's Day 1981, was instead caused by an electrical fault in the hot press of the bar.

48 young people all aged between 16 and 28 from the North Dublin area, died in the fire. Over 200 people were injured. As thick smoke filled the hall and the lights went out, panic and fear caused people to be crushed and trapped. Some of the exit doors were also locked.

The Taoiseach, Simon Harris, issued a public apology to the families on behalf of the state. He praised the families of the victims who fought for 43 years for justice for their loved ones who had been blamed in the wrong for causing this terrible fire.

He said that very many people had carried this tragedy with them over the years including the survivors and everyone who attended at the fire that night, the fire crews, the ambulance staff, the gardai, the army, the taxi drivers and the community in North Dublin.

The families have said they now believe their loved ones have been given back their good names instead of being blamed in the wrong.


