Death of Pope Francis



On Easter Monday the death was announced in Rome of Pope Francis, leader of the Catholic Church. Although he had spent some time in hospital in recent months, he gave a public blessing a day earlier, to the crowds who were gathered at Saint Peter's Basilica on Easter Sunday.

Born and raised in Argentina in South America, Jorge Mario Bergoglio chose the name Francis, when he became pope in 2013, following the retirement of Pope Benedict. It was unusual for a pope to retire from the role as normally a pope remains a pope until his death. Francis was the first pope to come from South America.

In 2018, Pope Francis visited Ireland. Large crowds turned out to welcome him in Dublin and at Knock Shrine in County Mayo. He held a private meeting where he met with survivors who, as children, had been sexually abused by members of the church and also those who had spent time in mother and baby homes run by the church. He listened to their experiences and later at a mass in the Phoenix Park, Pope Francis asked for forgiveness for the failure of the church to protect children.

He was regarded as the "pope of the poor". He set up an area of the Vatican for food and shelter and washing facilities for people who were homeless. He visited and said mass in the prisons regularly. He did not wear the silk robes and red shoes that was the tradition of former popes to wear, and he travelled around Rome in a small car rather than the large cars associated with the position.

He chose to live in a guest house in the city instead of in the Palace in the Vatican where all the other popes lived because he wanted to be around people.

In his time as Pope, he visited over 60 countries all over the world. In fact, the little bus that he travelled in when greeting the crowds in each country, known as the "Popemobile", will now be made into a mobile health clinic for children living in war torn Gaza. This was Pope Francis's wish before he died. He spoke out about topics that previous popes had not. He encouraged world leaders to seek peace to the wars in the world, show greater compassion to immigrants who have been forced to leave their countries and for us all to take greater care of our climate and the environment.

Hundreds of thousands of people stood for hours outside Saint Peter's Basilica, to pay their respects to the late pope as he lay in state for three days. His funeral was attended by leaders and heads of state from all over the world, including the Irish president Michael D Higgins and his wife Sabina, Prince William of England and President Donald Trump and former President Biden from America. Nine days after his funeral, 135 cardinals, Catholic Church leaders from all over the world, met behind closed doors to elect the new pope. This meeting, known as the Conclave, takes place every time a new pope must be elected.

After just two days, white smoke bellowed from a special chimney on the roof of the building to let the waiting crowds know that the new pope had been chosen. He is 69-year-old Robert Prevost, who will be known as Pope Leo XIV (14th). Born in Chicago he is the first pope to come from the United States of America.

More Irregular Past Tense Verbs





When we want to use an action word in the past, we usually add the letters ed to the verb.

Example: I walk five km every day. I walked 3 km yesterday.

I work 5 days a week. Last week, I worked 3 days.

However, for some action words we **do not use ed**. Instead, the word changes completely when we use them in the past tense.

Here are some more examples:

Catch / caught Try to catch it when I throw it. / I **caught** a fish last week.

Come / came I will **come** to see you later. / I **came** home late last night.

Eat / ate I eat an apple every day. / I ate a banana yesterday.

Fall / fell Be careful, do not **fall**. / He **fell** off the ladder.

Feel / felt I really **feel** for you. / I **felt** very cold when it was snowing.

Forget / forgot I forget your name. / I forgot to buy bread for lunch.

Give / gave Give me your name and address. / I gave her a hand with the work.

Leave / left I will **leave** after dinner. / I **left** the meeting early.

Meet / met What time will we **meet**? / I **met** Anne for lunch on Monday.

Ring / rang Will you **ring** me later? / I **rang** him but there was no answer.

Say / said I would like to **say** yes. / I **said** I will be there on time.

See / saw I **see** your point. / I **saw** a good film in the cinema.

Send / sent Send me your details. / I sent you a card in the post.

Speak / spoke Can you **speak** a little slower. / I **spoke** to the doctor.

Sell / sold I will **sell** my old computer. / I **sold** my car last year.




