

### **Facts about Ireland**

Ireland is made up of 4 parts. These parts are called provinces. Provinces were made in the 6th century when each one was ruled by a king. Each province also has its own flag. The 4 provinces are: **Ulster, Connacht, Leinster and Munster** 



Each province has its own counties. There are 32 counties in Ireland.



**Ulster has 9 counties** Armagh, Antrim, Derry, Down, Fermanagh, Tyrone, Cavan, Monaghan and Donegal.



**Connacht has 5 counties** Galway, Mayo, Sligo, Roscommon and Leitrim.



**Leinster has 12 counties** Dublin, Louth, Meath, Westmeath, Longford, Offaly, Laois, Kildare, Carlow, Kilkenny, Wicklow and Wexford.



**Munster has 6 counties** Clare, Limerick, Kerry, Cork, Tipperary and Waterford.

# **Rivers in Ireland**

This map shows the main rivers in Ireland. Ireland has many rivers.

- The longest river is the River Shannon which is 260km long
- There are 3 large lakes on the Shannon: Lough Allen, Lough Rea and Lough Derg

Most of the river's flow through large towns. Hundreds of years ago, people built their homes close to rivers. The rivers were used to transport goods from one place to another.



- The River Shannon flows through the towns of Carrick on Shannon, Athlone, Killaloe and Limerick City
- The River Liffey flows through Dublin
- The River Lagan flows through Belfast
- The River Lee flows through Cork
- The River Slaney flows through Wexford
- The River Nore flows through Kilkenny
- The River Suir flows through Carrick on Suir and Waterford City

We can walk up the hill every day, it only takes an hour to walk.


People climb up the mountain every weekend. It is very famous. People like to climb it, but it takes all day.
