Barry McGuigan - 40th anniversary of his World Boxing Title



This month marks the 40th anniversary of a memorable boxing match, that saw a young 24-year-old from Monaghan win the World Featherweight boxing title.

Barry McGuigan, nick named "The Clones Cyclone" had been boxing from a young age. He had represented Northern Ireland in the Commonwealth games and was a member of the Irish Olympic team in 1980.

In 1981, he turned professional and after four years, during which he won a European title, he was given the chance to fight for the world featherweight title. This fight was against the current holder of the title, at the time, Eusebio Pedroza from Panama in Central America. Pedroza had held the title for seven years and was an experienced and strong fighter.

On 8 June, 1985, in a football stadium on Loftus Road in London, in front of a crowd of more than 28,000 people, McGuigan took on the biggest fight of his career. At a time in Northern Ireland when the relationship between Catholics and Protestants was very tense, all differences were put aside when the whole of Ireland watched the fight on television. In fact, 19 million people tuned in from all over the world, to watch the young Irish boxer take on the mighty Pedroza.

Such was his support at the stadium, that it took McGuigan 12 minutes to walk from his dressing room to the ring, as fans cheered him on. His dad, who was a singer, sang a verse of the old Irish ballad, "Danny Boy" just before the fight began. McGuigan said afterwards that this was a very emotional moment for him.

When talking about Pedroza, McGuigan himself said afterwards that "He was an amazing champion, a champion for seven and a half years, longest reigning featherweight champion in history, so I knew I had to perform, I had to peak, I had to be at my best".

McGuigan lived up to his word. The fight lasted a full 15 rounds with both men fighting their hearts out. It was an even contest for the first 6 rounds, then McGuigan knocked the champion down in the 7th round. However, he got back up and fought to the end. The final rounds were McGuigan's as Pedroza no longer had the strength to match the Irish man.



The whole of Ireland, north and south, celebrated. Up to 75,000 people lined the streets of Belfast to greet McGuigan on his return from London. However, the following day 250,000 showed up in Dublin as he was driven through the streets on an open top bus.

Unfortunately, his term as world champion was short lived. A year later in a fight held in the blistering heat of Las Vegas, McGuigan lost his title to Steve Cruz. In fact, he had to be brought to hospital after the fight because of heat exhaustion.

Later that year he also parted ways with his manager, Barney Eastwood because they had a falling out when McGuigan claimed he had not been properly prepared for the fight. Barry McGuigan retired from boxing in 1989.

A special event took place in his native Clones in Monaghan recently to mark the 40th anniversary of the fight when a special viewing of the world title fight was shown and Barry McGuigan himself along with family, friends and supporters attended.


