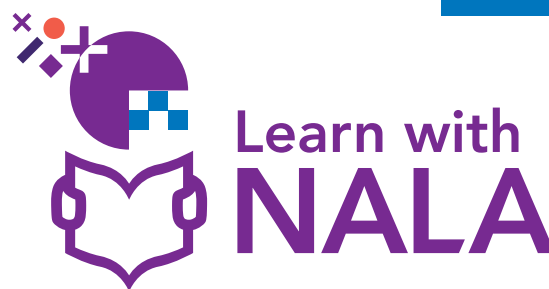


# Step into Learning

## Family carers

In Ireland, many people take care of family members at home. They look after a **child** or **adult** who is sick or has special needs or who is old. The family carers work very hard, but often people do not see their work. Sometimes carers do not think about their own **health** because they always help their loved ones first.

To say “thank you” **Family Carers Ireland** give awards every year. There are winners from all parts of Ireland. One person then wins the big prize of **Carer of the Year**.

In 2025, the Lidl Family Carer of the Year awards were given out by Miriam O’Callaghan from RTÉ (Raidió Teilifís Éireann). There were eight awards given out but the overall winner was Angie from Cork.



Angie cares for her twin sons. When Angie was **pregnant**, doctors said that Angie and her boys might not live. But Angie did not give up. The boys were born joined together. They share all organs except their hearts and each has one leg. Since then, Angie has looked after the boys as they have had to stay in **hospital** for many months.



They had **surgery** 75 times over the years. Some of these took place in other countries. Many times, she had to sleep on a hospital floor beside them to look after them. She also cares for her other children.

Angie teaches her boys to be strong. Today, they are 16 years old, they go to school and play sports. They have won gold and silver medals for Ireland in the **Paralympic** Games.

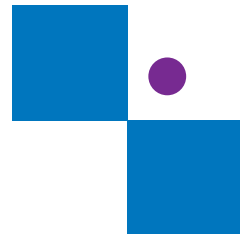

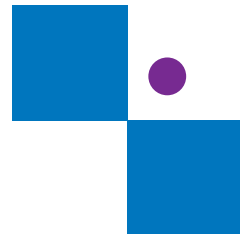
