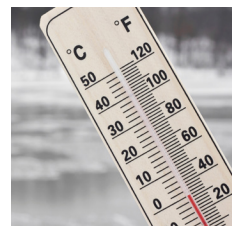
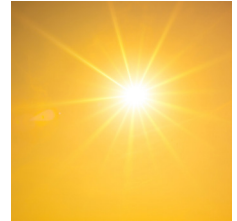
Sometimes it is cold in the morning and hot in the afternoon.

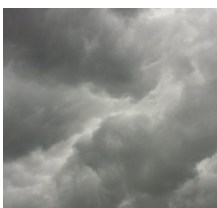

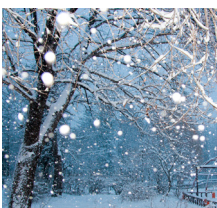

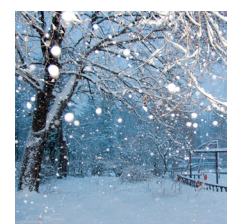
